# Pastor's Pen



#### **Alive with Christ**

I am writing this after snow-blowing another 10-12 inches out of the driveway. I hope when you read this, some, if not most, of the

snow is melting. April is a month of spring for us – yes, there are still the last gasps of the dying winter, but there are also the first true cries of spring. It is a season of new life. We often celebrate Easter in April. It is a great time to celebrate the new life we receive through Jesus' resurrection.

Celebrating our life in Christ is just what we are going to do in our Easter worship services. We will also keep that energy going by encouraging each other to connect with Jesus, our source of life. In the weeks between Easter and Pentecost, we will have the opportunity to engage in spiritual practices that will help us deepen our connection with God and help us grow spiritually.

We are focusing on spirituality, which means 'our awareness to and responsiveness to the presence of God. Spiritual practices help us to grow in our awareness of and responsiveness to God's presence in our lives. You might be wondering what spiritual practices are, and for a good reason, we don't often emphasize them. In general, spiritual practice is anything we do that helps us connect with God. Spiritual practices can be anything from reading the Bible, attending worship, and prayer to virtually anything that nurtures our relationship with God. You may have heard of this as 'spiritual discipline' or 'means of grace.' These are great names, and all mean the same thing. We will use spiritual practices as they remind us of our need to 'practice' them; we don't have to be perfect – we are practicing.

After Easter, we will practice our spiritual practices through a worship series called 'Alive with Christ.' In it, we will look at six spiritual practices that Christians have found especially helpful in growing spiritually throughout history. These include Prayer/Meditation, Study, Acts of Service, Sacraments/Worship, Witnessing, and Service to the Word. Each week we will hear in scripture the foundation of the spiritual practice and how it can connect us with God, and we will be encouraged to engage in the practice during the coming week.

You will learn more about this series as you keep reading the Pine Chips. Also, I want to invite you to participate in a Bible Study I will be leading starting in May. It will be about Jesus' parables and how we can seek to hear them in new ways. It will also build our Bible reading skills as a spiritual practice. So keep your eyes and ears open for more information.





The Ministry Council met on March 21, 2023, with the following members in attendance: Chris Anderson, Jim Anderson, Sue Claflin, Mary Fasse, Tom Frandy, Pastor Mark Gilbert, Merry Jorgensen, Sue Loeffler, Holly Nash, and Jerry Weber. Absent: Donna Clark, Dave Kozeluh, Sara Kozeluh, Noah Lottig, and Bob Schuld.

The meeting was called to order by Sue Loeffler, who shared the St. Patrick's Breastplate Prayer. Council members shared the church's accomplishments this past month, which included the Cabin Fever Fun Day and the Rice Meal Packing Event. Photo videos of both can be viewed on our church's website—

www.umchurchofthepines.org.

A Ministry Council job description was approved. Sue Loeffler and Jim Anderson will review the past five year's Council minutes and other committee job descriptions to identify items for the Council's annual calendar and will report at the April meeting.

Pastor Mark shared there has been an increase in mission activity for our church. And because of this, the Leadership Development Committee will look at identifying a volunteer to coordinate the flow of our church mission activities.

It was announced that the Men's Club of the church is able to provide funds for youth summer camp scholarships.

A fundraising idea that another church uses to raise funds each week for specific purposes or missions was suggested as something our church might want to try.

There are three areas that continue to be discussed each month at Council meetings: Community, Spirituality, and Enthusiasm.

Pastor Mark said there is work to be done in each area, but we are seeing successes. It was proposed that in this second quarter, the Council identify strategies for determining what we are going to do in each of these three areas.

The Council also continues to explore additional revenue streams for the church. One suggestion is that we look into renting out additional church space to be used as temporary office space for visitors to the area. The Trustees will look at what church spaces might be used for this purpose.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 18th, 7:00 p.m. in the Ministry Center.

# **UPDATE - Our Rice Meal Packets Have Been Shipped!**

On March 24th, we received notification from Midwest Mission Distribution Center that the rice meal packets that the youth of Church of the Pines assembled have been shipped to the distribution center in Poland. On March 8th, 15 of our Wednesday Church School students diligently worked to assemble 240 rice meal packets, along with six adult volunteers, coordinated by Venus Hilgart. These rice meal packets will provide 1,400 meals for the people of Ukraine. The packets prepared here were added to the packets prepared by 23 additional churches for a total of 37,720 rice meals that have been shipped to Poland. Once received in Poland, they will be split up among several

organizations that will transport the supplies. Some supplies will stay in Poland for Ukrainian refugees, and others will be driven to the front lines of the war to help those who cannot leave their homes. Midwest Mission Distribution Center partners with North Star Foundation for Ukraine shipments. This was Midwest Mission's ninth shipment to Ukraine since the beginning of the war.

"When a natural or human-caused disaster strikes outside of the United States, the United Methodist Committee on Relief International Disaster Response program (UMCOR IDR) serves as the primary channel for United Methodist assistance. The response includes support for displaced people and refugees fleeing disasters through food, water, hygiene, and other essential nonfood supplies and temporary shelter. Long-term, UMCOR cooperates with church leaders and local organizations to develop response mechanisms and to support local relief and recovery efforts.

UMCOR focuses on disasters that overwhelm a local community's ability to respond, such as storms and flooding, fires, volcanoes, war, and civil unrest.

Partners working with UMCOR select beneficiaries based on need and vulnerability as opposed to any other category (such as gender, race, or religion)."
