

## Pastor's Pen



A year ago, I wrote about the scripture about Mary Magdalene going to Jesus' tomb 'while it was still dark.' That powerful phrase reminded us that God is working even when things are too dark for us to see clearly, and that good news is on the way even while it is still dark. This Easter, we celebrate both Jesus' Resurrection and the beginning of the end of the pandemic. Just as the light of the new day fills us with hope, we are looking forward to things becoming normal. However, not everything will be the same when the pandemic is over; too much has changed.

I believe that Mary Magdalene and the other disciples wanted things to go back to 'normal' after Jesus appeared to them alive. Everything changed that first Easter. Jesus was alive again, but different. The disciples were not the same. They saw and understood things differently. Jesus also changed his ministry with them; they were no longer learning and helping; Jesus sent them out to change the world. He was telling them to be His witness in Jerusalem and to the whole world. Just like the first Easter, everything has changed for us this Easter. We have been changed by the transformational power of God's grace and love in Christ and through the Holy Spirit. The darkness of this pandemic has changed us. We have learned how to be the church differently, in meaningful ways. While much has changed, one thing that has not changed is Jesus is still sending us out to be his witness to transform the world into the Kingdom of God.

The United Methodist Church's mission statement is "Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." This purpose comes from the words that Jesus spoke to his disciples in the Gospels. It shapes the mission and purpose of our church and our lives. I think through all that has changed, we need to look at our mission a little differently.

We need to flip it to Transforming the world for Jesus and making new disciples of Christ. We need to work to transform the world first while we are making disciples. It's time for a change, to approach our life and work as followers of Jesus in a new way. After the first Easter, the disciples started doing things differently, and the things they did made a real difference in the lives of the people around them. You and I are here because of them.

We have learned that we can still be the church during the pandemic even when we couldn't do church how we always had. We can transform the world by making a real difference in our community right now, just like the disciples did in Jerusalem, and just like them when we work as agents of transformation for Christ in the world around us.

I believe that God is calling and preparing us to transform the world around us right here and right now. We must be willing to let God show us the way. I am inviting you to learn about the three areas that could affect real change as a congregation: poverty, medical debt, and racial relations. On Sunday, April 25, 2021, I will host a gathering and Zoom event at 3:00 pm. We will learn more about the three areas and what action we can take in each. Through this time, we will see where God leads us to transform the world and make disciples of Jesus Christ.



### Words to Live By Lay Leader Emerson Coy *"The power to live a beautiful life"*

Another Winter has ended. Even though this wasn't a harsh Winter in the Northwoods, other parts of the country had some hard times. We yearn for the Spring weather and the ability to move around more freely. When March 21st rolled around, it was like a breath of fresh air. We anticipate celebrating the newness of Spring and the excitement of Easter. It is refreshing to know the grass will soon be green. Knowing that Spring is here seems to cleanse our souls. I like to notice the signs of Spring. Buds begin to align the branches of the aspen. The sounds of birds chirping in the morning announce their return from the south. Bulbs close to the house start breaking the earth to bring forth a refreshing fragrance. Most of the snow is off our deck, so I went and retrieved the deck furniture, hoping that I didn't jump the gun.

As there are signs for the change of seasons, we have symbols that have meaning for us. The Golden Arches along the highway symbolizes fast food and maybe a quick turn into the restaurant. A highway stop sign indicates traffic may be coming, and we better obey. A wedding ring symbolizes unending love and promise. The definition of a symbol is "something that points to or participates in something greater than itself." In the history of the Christian Church and the feelings of love and feelings, symbols began to immerge. From the sign of the fish, the descending dove, fire, various forms of Latin and Greek crosses, Christianity has produced over 260 different symbols. One just has to look around in the U.M. Church of the Pines sanctuary, and you are surrounded by symbols on the stained-glass windows. Each one has a story and meaning. We even have a booklet about them and a CD. Most cultures have symbols that are important as well. At a Native American powwow, dancers circle around the drum in the direction the eagles usually fly. With Woodland Indians, the dances themselves interpret different animals and symbolize a oneness with nature and creation. Seeing a medicine wheel with the four colors has special meaning. If we know the meaning behind symbols, they mean so much more.

As we have traveled through the darkness of Winter, have sought a closer relationship with God during the season of Lent, we can't forget that our lives are symbolic, too. Our life and how we live it become a symbol to someone else that hopefully points to greater virtues like friendship, honesty, caring, leadership, and devotion. Most of us will never know the experiences that come to the rich and famous. Not many of us will qualify for the rank of "genius" in our business or profession. Few of us will become superior athletes, musicians, or artists. However, we all have the power to live a beautiful life that has a positive influence on those around us and leave a good memory when we are gone. Isn't that what matters most in life? It's not the public height in which we rise, but the fragrance which we communicate and leave behind. A shooting star symbolizes excitement and gets a lot of attention, but a beautiful rose has a longer-lasting influence. Because God loves you, you have the power to live a beautiful life, so live it to your fullest. Take care.







## Ministry Council, Operation: Compassion

### Ministry Council Meeting Summary

The Ministry Council met on March 16th, at 7:00 p.m. with the following members in attendance: Chris Anderson, Jim Anderson, Jodi Capacio, Sue Claflin, Donna Clark, Pastor Mark Gilbert, Merry Jorgensen, Rich Klatt, Dave Kozeluh, Sue Loeffler, Noah Lottig, Holly Nash, Perry Schuette, Bob Schuld, and Jerry Weber. Emerson Coy, Tom Frandy, and Ted Voigt were absent.

Council members took time to share Church of the Pines' accomplishments from this past month: Things that have been happening throughout the pandemic have been impressive, such as the drive-up Imposition of Ashes on Ash Wednesday and the Meal Ministry; a Lenten Bible Study that is currently being held; and appreciation for our Congregational Care Ministry volunteers who have reached out to others by sending notes and cards of encouragement.

A timeline was presented to the Ministry Council that outlines the process and procedures for Council members to follow in submitting their committee reports. After a short discussion, all agreed to follow this timeline for future Council meetings.

There was a conversation about how best to address future budget income concerns. Pastor Mark shared that three questions need to be answered: 1. What are the things we need to let go of? 2. What do we need to embrace? 3. What do we absolutely have to hold on to? In order to clearly define our desired end result, an adhoc group of Council members volunteered to meet with Bob Schuld to explore options that will be brought back to the Ministry Council. Members volunteering to serve on this adhoc committee include: Dave Kozeluh, Noah Lottig, Jerry Weber, Pastor Mark Gilbert, and Bob Schuld.

There was considerable discussion regarding the re-opening of the church for in-person worship services and activities. Positive progress is seen in the reduced number of virus infections, the number of hospitalizations, and the increased number of people receiving vaccines. The Infection Control Team has been asked to meet to review our church's re-opening guidelines and procedures, update as necessary, and submit a revised document, along with recommendations on when in-person activities can resume and the plan for doing this. If necessary, a special Ministry Council meeting will be called to review this and take action.

The next regularly scheduled meeting will be Tuesday, April 20, 2021, at 7:00 p.m.

With there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
