



Pastor's Message



Today Years Old...

There is a popular slang term that is going around in our culture. It is an expression of bewilderment about learning something new about a topic you thought you already knew. So it goes, 'I was today years old when I learned...' You can insert whatever you learned that you hadn't known before. For example, I was today years old when I realized the plastic things at

the end of shoelaces were called 'aglets.'

While the phrase is just a humorous way of expressing surprise at learning something new, I like the idea that we are never too old to learn new things. Especially learning new things about topics that we thought we already knew about. I share all this because I was today years old when I learned about a new way to understand the parable of the talents that blew me away.

I recently read a discussion about the parable in Matthew 25:14-30 about how we have traditionally understood this parable may not be the way Jesus intended it to be understood. We usually think of God as the master who gives differing amounts of gold to three servants before leaving on the trip. We hear what each servant does with the gold while the master is away. We also hear how the master deals with each servant based on what they did with the gold given to them.

The first two servants use the gold to make more money for the master, which pleases the master and rewards them. The third servant buries the gold one in the ground and gives the master back the same amount. The master is mad at the third servant and punishes him. We typically think this parable calls us to use God's gifts to create some return or profit for God, thereby gaining a reward from God.

Now here is the part that flips this all around. In the parable, the third servant describes the master as a 'hard man' (some translations even say 'evil man') who reaps where he does not sow... This line calls us to rethink our understanding of the parable. In all of the parables that Jesus shares, I cannot find another example of him describing God as a hard' or 'evil' master like this. Let alone the idea that we have to earn a reward from God is a direct contradiction of the free grace of God. I had read and preached this parable countless times before and never thought about it this way.

The discussion I heard this in lifted that perhaps Jesus was encouraging us to examine how we participate in the systems of this world that exploit others...' reaping what we do not sow.' It could call us to stand against the injustice and inequality of human economics. To add support to this idea, this parable is immediately followed by the parable of the sheep and goats in Matthew's Gospel. A parable that calls us to act for justice and mercy for all people.

I share all this for two reasons. First is to remind you that you are never too old to experience the Bible in new ways. The second is to invite you to a Bible study this year. I will lead a class starting in May (more information coming next month) about the parables of Jesus, where we will have opportunities to learn something new together and say, 'I was today years old....'



Stephen Ministry Anniversary of Commissioning

The UMCOP Stephen Ministry Team will celebrate the 17th anniversary of the commissioning of the Stephen Ministers on March 12, 2023.

Stephen Ministers undergo intense training by Stephen Leaders to be equipped to listen to and support people in crisis. Stephen ministers do not replace pastors, but help to share in the church's ministry of caring. They free the pastor to do what only he/she can do as the Stephen Ministers can devote much more time to an individual with special needs. By having trained lay persons, the pastor can have reassurance that people are receiving quality care.

Highlights from this past month were shared: The Children, Youth, and Family Ministry potluck; donations of socks and underwear for Ukraine; fire response donations; Pastor Mark was quoted in a Lakeland Times article where he spoke about the Rocking Horse Child Care Center's closing due to the employment shortage in our community.

The standing church committee job descriptions have been updated and were approved by the Ministry Council. Each of the committees will be highlighted in upcoming newsletters. Lay Leadership is highlighted in this newsletter on pages 10 and 11.

The Ministry Council is sponsoring the March 5th Cabin Fever Fun Day. Dave and Sara Kozeluh are leading a cross-country ski and snowshoe outdoor adventure beginning at 2:00 p.m. Pastor Mark will organize indoor games at the church beginning at 2:00 pm. 

Mission Highlights

Family and Children's Services provides services predominately for the poor and focuses on crisis intervention, rebuilding lives, and strengthening families. These ministries are very dependent on contributions from the Conference and congregations since they are used as matching funds to obtain foundation, business, and government grants. Services are in the area of head-start programs, life-skill training, homeless shelters, food pantries, gang prevention, nutrition education, parenting training, and transitional living.

UMCOR US Disaster Response - When disaster happens, it is local churches that provide the first response to their communities. This basic understanding, that disaster response is local, forms the foundation for UMCOR's US disaster training and response.

When responding to a disaster in the United State, UMCOR works with the conference disaster response ministries to provide the following:

Financial Assistance - Emergency grants may be sent when a bishop of the affected conference contacts UMCOR.

Expertise - UMCOR's disaster response experience and knowledge are made available to those in need.

Networking - Connections with NGOs, volunteers, experts, local government and other organizations can help communities recover from disaster.


