

Pastor's Pen



Pastor's Pen

A few weeks ago, in April, we began a sermon series called Alive with Christ. The series focuses on six spiritual practices that help us live with Jesus like the first disciples. Peter, James, John, and the other disciples had a fantastic opportunity to live with Jesus after the first Easter. They were alive with Christ; they could ask questions, reach out and touch him, and break bread with him regularly. The disciples were keenly aware of Jesus' presence with them and were very responsive to what Jesus asked of them.

Today, we are not as fortunate as the first disciples to live with Jesus, but that does not mean that Jesus is not alive with us and that we cannot be aware of his presence with us. It just takes a bit more effort than it did the first disciples; it takes practice.

We understand the spirituality of our faith, and to me, the awareness of and responsiveness to the presence of God in our lives. We become more aware and responsive to God the more we practice. The Alive with Christ series has been lifting various Spiritual practices that we can use to help us be alive with Christ, just like the first disciples. The first and foremost way we can practice and live with Christ is through the spiritual practice of prayer.

As I shared in worship, prayer is foundational to all other spiritual practices and essen-

tial for a life with Christ. Prayer is God's primary way to connect and communicate with us. Prayer is like air – we breathe without thinking, and we know when there is no air. It should be the same way for our spiritual life. Throughout the Christian tradition, we have experienced how God is a willing participant in prayer. God encourages us to pray without ceasing.

It is no wonder that prayer is a common part of our faith and tradition. Prayer has become very familiar to us, and that is a good thing. Yet familiarity makes it easy to take it for granted or diminish its significance in our lives. For this reason, I want to encourage all of us, as part of the Church of the Pines to intentionally practice prayer in our lives.

Fortunately, there are lots of ways for us to practice prayer, and you try things until you find a form of prayer that works for you. I am sharing a few ways to practice prayer intentionally later in this newsletter. Remember, the purpose of prayer is connection and communication with God. As we practice prayer, we become more aware of God's presence with us and become more responsive to God's call in our lives.



Highlights this past month included how well the Holy Week and Easter worship services went and snow removal done by the Trustees.

The Ministry Council continues to work on establishing their annual church calendar, and identifying activities for the next two quarters of 2023 for our focus areas of Community, Spirituality, and Enthusiasm.

Chris Anderson, Jerry Weber, and Pastor Mark will review our current Winter Weather Policy and bring suggested changes to the Council next month regarding church closures during the week, which was not addressed in the current policy.

Pastor Mark, Mary Fasse, and a couple of additional people will talk about how we might best evaluate our summer worship services. There will be an 8:30 a.m. Sunday morning outdoor worship service again this summer in the backyard of the church.

Security cameras have been installed at the church, with work still being done on one of the cameras.

The Trustees are continuing to explore additional income streams for the church.

"Onesies" are being collected for In-gathering at the June Wisconsin UMC Annual Conference

Each year, our congregation collects items needed by Midwest Mission Distribution Center for their "Kits" that are assembled and sent where needed around the world. This year, we are collecting "onesies" that will become part of the Layette Kits. Beginning April 30th, bins will be placed at the back of the sanctuary where "onesies" can be placed. Sue Loeffler, one or our Lay Members to Annual Conference is coordinating this mission project. Thank you, Sue!

How to participate: Purchase NEW onesies, 0-6 months size. The onesies cannot be made of fabrics with hand prints, foot prints, paw prints, or camouflage. The collection begins April 30th. The last Sunday to place items in the bins is before the June 4th worship service.

Generations-Lakeland Retirement Foundation. The Lakeland Retirement Foundation's mission is to build a community that promotes wellness, learning, services and fullness of life for the aging population of the Lakeland area. The residents of these communities are served: Arbor Vitae, Hazelhurst, Lac du Flambeaus, Lake Tomahawk, Minocqua, and Woodruff. Residents, ages 55 and older, are encouraged to use the nonprofit facility to meet new people and get information that may help them in times of need. www.lakelandretirement.org

Mujilla Falls Agriculture Center is an official project of the General Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church. It was founded in 2000 with a grant of 2,500 acres of land from a Lunda Chief named Kanyama.

They have been developing the land as a research center and training facility for local entry level farmers.

They focus primarily on food production and increasing the protein, vitamins and mineral levels in the local diets and increasing incomes for local people. Products include milk, yogurt, eggs, rabbits, goats, sheep, pigs, turkeys, garden produce, strawberries, plantains, bananas, guavas, mangoes, lemons and citrus, field crops, pine trees and many other items.



Golden Cross Sunday special offering will be held at Church of the Pines on May 7th. Golden Cross began in 1908 with the commitment of Methodists in Dallas, Texas to provide the first health care to persons who could not afford it. They began to receive offerings for the expenses of the poor patients at Methodist Hospital in that city. By 1930, the concept was officially adopted throughout the predecessor denominations of The United Methodist Church. Today, Golden Cross is a ministry that reaches out in love to the laity in our Annual Conference who are experiencing financial difficulty due to excessive medical expenses. Through Golden Cross, United Methodists care for members of our local churches in time of emotional stress and financial need.

Prayer Practices

- 1. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
- Jesus taught this prayer when disciples did feel they knew how to pray. It's a great place for us to start practicing prayer ourselves!

 Try praying it slowly twice a day, go phrase by phrase and contemplate what you are praying.

2. Use the ACTS style of prayer.

- Based on the structure of the Lord's Prayer, ACTS prayer outlines our prayer when we feel we need more structure.
- A adoration and praise, C confession,
 T thanksgiving, S supplication

3. Pray the following "Willing Servant Prayer."

- If you feel comfortable in your prayer life, try being intentional about praying to be responsive to God's direction with the following prayer: Awesome God, I am praying that you will guide me to make a real difference in the lives of people in our community. I want to partner with you now and into the future. May my heart, mind, ears, and eyes be open to your guidance so that I may open my hands in service. Amen.
- Pick a time each morning and evening and commit praying it for at least a month.
- 4. Practice Christian meditation in prayer.
- Christian meditation is a focused form of prayer that seeks to allow God to fill our senses, minds, imaginations fully with God's present.
- Use a focal point like a short passage of scripture, an image like the wounds of Christ, or even something from creation. Allow yourself to stay focused on this while opening yourself to what God wants to share with you.
