



Welcome to February 2024. Happy Leap Year! We have 29 days in February this year, and I think we need them. Here in Wisconsin, we often are grateful for a short February as it is still winter, and spring seems like months away. Valentine's Day is often the only exciting thing happening, but not this year. Two exciting things are happening in the life of Church of the Pines during February.

The first is the season of Lent, which begins on February 14, 2024. What a neat thing that Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are on the same day. Valentine's is a day to celebrate love, and Ash Wednesday is


the start of a holy journey that culminates in the ultimate expression of God's love for us, combined this year on the same day! In honor of this great combination, our Lenten worship is focused on the depth of God's love for us. More details about this focus can be found in this newsletter.

The second thing happening this February is we will take a key first step in working towards our mission focus of increasing food security in our community and throughout the world. We begin by offering an excellent study called "Hunger at Our Doorstep." This study, developed by the Wisconsin Council of Churches, is an excellent resource for congregations like ours that want to make a difference in the world. The class combines a Bible study and real-life information about the issue of food security. What I like about it is that we will not only learn about what the Bible says about the issue of hunger and what is meant when we talk about the term' food security,' but we will also learn practical ways for us to engage with others in a variety of actions that are shown to be effective.

Please join me and the congregation's leadership in attending "Hunger at Our Doorstep" during this season of Lent. The class begins on Thursday, February 15, 2024, at noon and will have five sessions. There is a sign-up sheet in the Ministry Center, or contact Merry in the church office to register. There is no cost to attend this class. We will also record each session and upload it to our YouTube channel.

As you can see, there is much to be excited about this February. I am happy for that extra day!



Winter Weather Cancelation Policy

Sunday Morning Worship

For severe winter weather, cancelation of the Sunday Worship service will be considered when there is dangerous ice and when there is a winter storm warning.

A decision to cancel worship services during a winter storm will be made no later than 6:00 p.m. on Saturday evening. A mass email and phone call will be made to the church membership, and a special notification will be sent via MailChimp to everyone who subscribes to our church Weekly Updates. Notifications will also appear on our Facebook page and sent to local television stations that provide cancelation notices for church activities.

Weekday Church Activities and Office Hours

Children, Youth, and Family ministries will be canceled if schools are closed or if after school activities are canceled. Parents will be notified via email.

The Church office and other church adult ministries will be closed at the discretion of the pastor and/or the Chair of the related ministry, based on safety. Appropriate forms of communication will be used to inform the congregation.

February, Lent. and Easter Worship



February 4 - Sunday, 10 am

Scripture: Isaiah 40:21-31 and Psalm 147:1-11 **Theme:** Trusting God and Finding Strength. Have you not heard? Have you not known? The prophet Isaiah expressed God's surprise that the people of Israel have lost hope and feel threatened in all things. God reminds them and us that when we place our trust in God and not in ourselves or other earthly powers, we find hope and all the strength we need to face all the chaos of life.

February 11 - Transfiguration Sunday - 10 am

Scripture: Mark 9:2-9
Theme: Higher Resolution.

The only constant is change. Perhaps not. While change is a part of life, some things do not change. God's love for us never changes, but sometimes we understand it better. We see it more clearly with higher resolution. It seems like Jesus changes before the disciples' eyes in this passage, but they are actually seeing him more clearly than before.

Lenten Worship











Depth of Love

The Season of Lent is a time of self-reflection and spiritual examination. While that is a healthy and necessary exercise, we don't examine ourselves in isolation. Instead, we are invited to lay our lives alongside the life of Jesus. It is a sobering exercise to say the least. And yet, what we discover in this

examination of his life and ours, is not condemnation or recrimination. Instead, the further we go on this journey with him, the more overwhelmed we are by his depths of love for all of us. Lent is a time for getting our spiritual house in order, which is true. But, it is an invitation to commit once again to love like Christ loves.

February 14 - Ash Wednesday - 10 am

Scripture: Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

Theme: Ash Wednesday is about refocusing and realigning ourselves in relationship to God and one another. We must encounter our sinfulness and frailty not with shame and blame but with honesty and truth, trusting that God receives our confession.

February 18 - First Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: Mark 1:9-15 **Theme:** Fast Start.

The Gospel of Mark starts at a fast pace, quickly moving from major event to major event. Wait, aren't there more details to these stories? Why is it moving so fast? Life doesn't always wait for us to catch our breath, either. Look at our church year. Barely a month ago, we were still in the Christmas Season. Now, we are in the season of Lent! Here we go. Let's start our Journey with Jesus to explore the depth of God's love.

February 25 - Second Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: Mark 8:31-38 **Theme:** The Way of the Cross.

Loving is not easy. It is challenging and often requires sacrifice. Jesus begins to teach the true depth of God's love as he describes the challenges and sacrifices God makes to express his love to us.

March 3 - Third Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: John 2:13-22

Theme: When Love Gets Angry.

We see Jesus getting angry today. It might seem shocking to picture Jesus yelling at people, overturning tables, and using physical force, but sometimes love means we get angry. Jesus' anger is an expression of the depth of God's love for us. What can we learn from when Jesus gets angry?

Lent and Easter Worship. Lenten Devotional

March 10 - Fourth Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: John 3:14-21

Theme: God's Love is really Deep.

Jesus' familiar words to Nicodemus challenge us to open our eyes to how deep God's love truly is. It is easy for us to focus on the surface level of God's love - God's love for you, for me. But that is just the surface. God's love is for all people. I mean all.

March 17 - Fifth Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: John 12:20-33 Theme: Serving is Love

We hear a familiar expression about following God today. We are reminded of the depth of God's love for us in Jesus's service to us, but we are also encouraged to show the depth of God's love in our

service to others.



March 24 — Palm/Passion Sunday - 10 am Scripture of the Palms: Mark 11:1-11

Theme: Today, we celebrate and welcome Jesus into Jerusalem, and we hear the true depth of his love for us in the Passion story from the Gospel of Mark.

March 28 — Holy Thursday - 7 pm Scripture of the Palms: John 13:1-17

Theme: God's Love for You.

Do you let God express God's Love to you? Or do you, like Peter, draw away for a moment? Tonight, let God tell you how much you are loved. Receive it. Let it wash over you. Let it fill you to overflowing.

March 29 — Good Friday - Noon A Service of Tenebrae

We will hear the passion of Christ and experience with the first disciples the darkening of the world as Christ goes to the cross.



March 31 - Easter Sunday! - 10 am

Scripture: Mark 16:1-7 Theme: Love enough to Live.

Oh, the depth of the divine love we have experienced leading up to this day. What 'weight of glory' we see this day as the cross and tomb stand empty before us. Yet, where is Jesus? Mark tells us that we will him as he said, but where? So, we look to see Jesus.

The Sanctuary for Lent 2024 contains brief readings for each day in Lent, from Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday, including a suggested Scripture, a short devotion, and a short prayer or practice—all based on the Revised Common Lectionary.

Stephen Ministry



Have you ever judged a gift by its wrapping? If a gift was wrapped in plain paper with no bow, what were your expectations? Compare it with a gift wrapped expertly in thick, decorative paper, with a handsome bow. Were your expectations higher?

As we have just started the New Year, we all have some expectations of what the year will be like. What do our expectations tell us?

Knowing Emmanuel, God is with us, we should be expecting good. Our lives are lived best when we **expect** God to be at work for our good – when we believe that God **can** and **will** work for our good. Our outlook for the day and even the year changes when we expect good.

This may take a while to learn.

When Mary, the mother of Jesus, was told, as a virgin, she was going to have a child, the Son of God, what were her expectations? Many of us would have been nervous and worried about all the repercussions: what would Joseph do, what would the community think, how would this change her life? Mary, though, accepted the news, and she actually praised God:

"My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

Mary had great expectations.

Develop your view of the world to be one of awe and wonder. Rather than looking for miracles, shift to seeing everything as miraculous. Someone said, "expectation is the breeding ground for miracles."

By being in a state of awe, you won't be able to mentally experience boredom or disappointment. Try seeing the invisible God flowing through and supporting everyone and everything. A rainstorm becomes a miraculous event, the lightning a fascinating display of electrical fireworks, the thunder a booming reminder of the invisible power of nature. Live the mystery by beginning to perceive what average eyes fail to notice. So what do you expect? Remember, as Jonathan Lockwood Huie said, "A wonderful gift may not be wrapped as you expect."

This year, 2024, look for miracles, and you will find them.

Ministry Council Meeting Summary, Cabin Fever Fun Day

Ministry Council Meeting Summary

The Ministry Council met on January 23, 2024, with the following members in attendance: Sue Claflin, Mary Fasse, Tom Frandy (representing Trustees), Pastor Mark Gilbert, Jay Hull, Merry Jorgensen, Dave Kozeluh, Sara Kozeluh, Sue Loeffler, Bob Nash, and Bob Schuld. Absent: Noah Lottig and Jerry Weber.

Jay Hull and Bob Nash were welcomed as new Council members, class of 2026. Highlights of UMCOP church life were noted: The Change for Hunger offering began in January and will be held the first Sunday of each month; 229 socks were donated to the Lakeland Pantry during the Drive that was held in December; A Pancake Brunch was held on January 18; Christmas Eve Worship services were well-attended; and the Bible Study on the Parables began in January, is going well, and has 15 people participating.

The new Missions Team held its first meeting. It recommended to the Council that the Missions Focus Plan, which was previously approved, be revised to change the name of the new monthly special offering from "Noisy Offering" to "Change for Hunger" and that we collect the offering throughout the year and disperse the proceeds at the end of the year to the recipient organizations. These changes were approved.

Bob Schuld, Finance Chair, reviewed the 2024 Operating Budget and the 2024 Budget for Facilities Operation & Maintenance. After responding to a few questions regarding the proposed budget, the Ministry Council approved the Finance Committee's recommended church budget for 2024.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 20, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. in the Ministry Center.

Soup Supper Potluck



Stained-glassed Widows of Church of the Pines

Architectural features of the United Methodist Church of the Pines include its beautiful stained glass windows. Photos of the windows are being featured on our Facebook page this year. Every window depicts an aspect of our Christian faith. Let's look at some of the windows and learn more about them.

As we sit in the pews in the church sanctuary on Sunday mornings, we see the three stained-glassed windows depicting the Trinity above the altar.



The window on the left in the photo represents God the Father. The familiar symbol of the all-seeing eye represents God. Below is a likeness of the Bible, the Father's inspiring counsel to His children and the Christian's guide for living. The light rays symbolize the outpouring of God's creative activity in life



The center stained glass window above the altar in the sanctuary of Church of the Pines represents God the Son. The lamb, meaning Christ as the "lamb of God," is shown reclining upon a book of seven seals (Revelations 5:1). He is holding a banner, often referred to as the Resurrection banner, symbolizing Christ's victory over death. The three-rayed nimbus surrounding the lamb's head signifies divinity. "Then I saw in the right hand of the one seated on the throne a scroll written on the inside and on the back, sealed with seven seals;" - Revelation 5:1.





God the Holy Spirit (on the right when looking at the photo.) In this window, the most authentic symbol of the Holy Spirit is the descending dove with the tri-radiant nimbus. It is based on the account of the baptism of Jesus in Matthew 3:13-17. "Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?' But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.' Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

Do you know what this stained glass window represents? Where is it located in the church? Take a close-up look at it this Sunday when you attend the worship service at 10:00 a.m. Hint: It is in the sanctuary. This window is called "Worship." Praying hands symbolize the fellowship with God, which we are privileged to have through prayer. It is so clearly related to worship and our need for it that the two are found together. The cross denotes God's redeeming love through Jesus Christ, our Lord.


