Pastor's Message, March Mission Match

I have shared much about our core values and mission focus for the Church of the Pines for several months, and I am super excited about the direction they set for us to fulfill God's mission as a community of faith. Quiz time: What is our four-year mission focus? What are our three core values?

I am confident that all of you answered those questions without hesitation and spoke them aloud confidently. But in case you need clarification, our four-year mission focus is to increase food security in our community and throughout the world.

Our core values as a congregation are:
Community, Spirituality, and Generosity.

We define **Community** as growing closer to God, one another, and all our neighbors. **Spirituality** is our increasing awareness of and responsiveness to the presence of God in our lives. And **Generosity** is how we enthusiastically share all that we are and have with God and the world.

I said above that I was confident that you knew these things already. It may have seemed like I was joking. I wasn't, though; I meant it because I see how you all express these values and practically live them out regularly. For example, I was recently approached by a church member who wanted to share something with me. They told me they usually give a gift directly to a local organization that works to feed hungry people in our community. They knew our mission focus and values and that we were partnering with this organization, so they were giving that gift as an additional gift to the Church of the Pines to further our mission focus. It truly exemplifies the generosity of our community of faith! But they didn't just want to tell me about their gift; they wanted to give the rest of us a chance to be generous, too! They suggested we do a matching challenge with their gift.

So that is precisely what we will do this month of March. If you make a special additional gift to our mission focus fund, your gifts will be matched up to \$2000! This is an incredible opportunity to increase food security in our community and throughout the world. You can join the matching challenge by designating a special gift to **missions**. Put 'missions' in the memo line if you give by check. Winter Weather Cancellation Policy

Sunday Morning Worship

For severe winter weather, cancellation of the Sunday Worship service will be considered when there is dangerous ice and when there is a winter storm warning.

A decision to cancel worship services during a winter storm will be made no later than 6:00 p.m. on Saturday evening. A mass email and phone call will be made to the church membership, and a special notification will be sent via MailChimp to everyone who subscribes to our church Weekly Updates. Notifications will also appear on our Facebook page and sent to local television stations that provide cancellation notices for church activities.

Weekday Church Activities and Office Hours

Children, Youth, and Family ministries will be canceled if schools are closed or if after school activities are canceled. Parents will be notified via email.

The Church office and other church adult ministries will be closed at the discretion of the pastor and/or the Chair of the related ministry, based on safety. Appropriate forms of communication will be used to inform the congregation.

Lenten Worship



March 3 - Third Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: John 2:13-22

Theme: When Love Gets Angry.

We see Jesus getting angry today. It might seem shocking to picture Jesus yelling at people, overturning tables, and using physical force, but sometimes love means we get angry. Jesus' anger is an expression of the depth of God's love for us. What can we learn from when Jesus gets angry?

March 10 - Fourth Sunday of Lent - 10 am

Scripture: John 3:14-21

Theme: God's Love is Really Deep.

Jesus' familiar words to Nicodemus challenge us to open our eyes to how deep God's love truly is. It is easy for us to focus on the surface level of God's love - God's love for you, for me. But that is just the surface. God's love is for **all** people. I mean all.



CHANGE FOR HUNGER




As part of our new Mission Focus Plan, a special offering called Change for Hunger will be taken during the worship service on the first Sunday of each month.

The Ministry Council met on February 20th, with the following members in attendance: Sue Clafin, Mary Fasse, Tom Frandy (representing Trustees), Pastor Mark Gilbert, Jay Hull, Merry Jorgensen, Sara Kozeluh, Sue Loeffler, and Bob Schuld. Absent: Dave Kozeluh, Noah Lottig, Bob Nash, Holly Nash, and Jerry Weber.

Highlights from the past month were shared and included a well-attended Pancake Brunch organized by Holly and Bob Nash. Donations in the amount of \$342.00 will be given to the Lakeland Pantry and breakfast food items were taken to the Lakeland Pantry; the Esther/Martha Circle coordinated the baking of Valentine’s Day cookies, decorated boxes for the cookies, and delivered them to church members and friends who are alone, are no longer able to attend church services or activities, or who are recovering from illness. The Deborah Circle decorated Valentine’s Day cards that were included with the boxes of cookies; conference reports were submitted; the 2024 annual church budget was approved; Ash Wednesday service on February 13th had

twenty-four people in attendance and at least six people watched online; and Sue Loeffler spent two weeks volunteering at Midwest Mission Distribution Center in Pawnee, Illinois.

The Council approved the new Missions Team Ministry description and the revisions made to the new Mission Focus Plan. Pastor Mark also shared the following: A bulletin board will be installed in the Ministry Center for the posting of Mission-related information; a “Welcome Center” will be located in the back of the sanctuary where information for worship guests will be located; an Information cabinet will be placed in the Ministry Center where people can sign up for programs and other church activities; and the UMCOP Vision and Values will be posted on the walls near the two main church entrances.

Council members discussed how we will know if we are successful in each of our focus areas of Community, Spirituality, and Generosity.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 19th, at 7:00 p.m. in the Ministry Center.

Stephen Minister Commissioning Anniversary, United Women in Faith, Upcoming Activities

Why is it called "Stephen Ministry"? In Acts 6, Stephen was among those chosen to provide caring ministry to those in need. Since Jesus' time, caring ministry has been a hallmark of the Christian faith community.

What are Stephen Ministers? They are lay persons who undergo intense training by Stephen Leaders to be equipped to listen to and support people in crisis. Stephen Ministers do not replace pastors, but help to share in the church's ministry of caring. They free the pastor to do what only he/she can do as the Stephen Ministers can devote much more time to an individual with special needs. By having trained lay persons, the pastor has reassurance that people are receiving quality care.

The Stephen Ministry team wants to thank the congregation for their support. We encourage you to seek out a Stephen Minister if you or someone you care about are facing difficulties by contacting Holly Nash, the Stephen Leader, at 715-356-6861 or through the church office.


