Pastor's Message



Conference and Denominational Updates

What an excellent beginning of the year for us here at Church of the Pines. We have had several exciting things going on and beginning. I

have shared our new Vision and Mission statements, Special Mission focus, and a new worship time to enhance our worship experience. We have accomplished awesome things during this time. We have begun our food security mission focus with enthusiasm and generosity. The congregational giving challenge is a great example; in just one month, you all donated over \$4000 to increase food security in our community and worldwide.

There are many things to celebrate and look forward to as part of the Church of the Pines—so much so that I have forgotten a few things happening in the Wisconsin Annual Conference and the United Methodist Denomination. So, let me catch you up on what is happening in our larger church community.

First, the United Methodist Church General Conference, initially scheduled for the summer of 2020 and postponed due to the pandemic, is finally being held right now! It started on April 23, 2024, and runs through May 3, 2024. This General Conference has much to do in sorting out the stance of the UMC on human sexuality and regular church business, as well as sorting out the aftermath of the denominational split with the creation of the Global Methodist Denomination. I encourage all of you to pray for this General Conference. We will let you know what comes out of this General Conference and how it may affect us here at the Church of the Pines.

The second thing is that the Wisconsin Annual Conference is undergoing a redistricting to utilize our resources most effectively. We are in the North Central District, and the Rev. Tsuker Yang is our District Superintendent. The district will be redrawn starting in July, and we will become part of the Northeast District. Rev. Yang will be retiring after a long and meaningful ministry. The Rev. Park Hunter will be our new District Superintendent. I have known Park for many years and am excited about his ministry and leadership for us.

Lastly, and most significantly, Bishop Jung, our Bishop for the last 12 years, is retiring. We will be celebrating his ministry during the Wisconsin Annual Conference this June. Bishop Jung came to the Church of the Pines in the Summer of 2013, prayed for our church at our altar, and met with a wonderful group of people from the church. He helped move Church of the Pines forward by encouraging us to, in his words, Imagine Wisconsin Anew!

With Bishop Jung's retirement, we will have a new experience at the Wisconsin Annual Conference. We will be sharing our next bishop with the Northern Illinois Annual Conference. Our conferences are not merging; the same bishop will serve both annual conferences.

I know these are some really big things. I promise to let you know how they will affect us in the months to come. However, none of them will change who we are as the Church of the Pines or the wonderful ministry we are doing here together as we continue to live Christ's love!



Members of Church of the Pines had the opportunity to shine a light on those members of our church family who came before us, living out our church's mission of "Living Christ's Love" to make and grow disciples of Jesus Christ to love and serve the world, and who served, providing opportunities for others to connect with God, one another, and their neighbors - Community: who helped other grow in awareness and responsiveness to God's presence - Spirituality, and shared all they were and all that they had with God and the world - Generosity.

Here are some of the memories of how the "ripples" left by some of our church embers who came before us impacted our church, our community, and the world.

Bev Melms and Jeanne Heck (Memories by Pat Bechtel)

"After Kay Rhyner invited me to her home for a Dawn Circle meeting a number of years ago, my Christian life changed. In Dawn Circle, I met many wonderful ladies to look up and to try to emulate and learn from. Two stand out in my mind. First, Bev Melms and I seemed to make an instant connection. She was a warm, kind woman who always met me with a huge smile and a hug. I looked up to her for guidance just as I would a mother who was always waiting with love in her eyes. One thing I remember about her was how much pride she took in being the "flower lady" and making sure that the altar was always adorned and beautiful on Sundays. She always seemed to be happy doing any job that was needed and coached me on when, what and how these tasks needed to be accomplished. For someone "green" and growing up in another faith, this was invaluable and necessary.

Jeanne Heck was another matron of Dawn Circle. Her long and vast experience as a true Methodist always seemed to show through.

Jeanne Heck seemed like she was always ready to share some of that knowledge and keep our circle on track. This was and is not an easy task! Whenever you needed advice on or more knowledge about something, Jeannie was the one to go to. I hope that our younger women will also be able to garnish some of that insight that only comes with experience and learn from those that have lived through it.

I know that I have given either of these ladies enough praise or accolades. Neither of them ever looked for praise, which was just another virtue of these two women in the history and life of United Methodist Church of the Pines.

Dawn Circle has been a haven for nurturing and security for many of us because of women like these. I think one of the take-aways of this short bit of recognition is that we all need to have someone to mentor and to nurture us."

Bill & Lois Nicholson and Jack Hallock (Memories by Patty Frandy)

"Bill Nicholson was a shining example of a man with a generous loving heart. He often bought a bucket of ice cream and cones for Rocking Horse or for the Sunday School so the children could have a treat. One Sunday in church, Rev. Ray Robinson announced a new project, "Adopt-a-Window." The outside trim of the sanctuary windows needed a fresh coat of pain, and Rev. Ray was asking families to adopt a window and paint it. Bill didn't always hear so well, so he thought that Rev. Ray had said "Adopt-a-Widow," and by the times church was over, he had asked Irma Biek out to lunch and was eyeing up another widow. But that was Bill; he was all about people, not things!

Bill's wife, Loise, was another one who was always doing things for the church. When she was younger, she taught Sunday School. Here at the Church of the Pines she was very active in the United Methodist Women and served as President. She married Bill when she was 15 years old. Usually, that would be a disaster, but not in this case. Both were dedicated to each other, to their church, and to God."

'It used to be the custom at Church of the Pines after the 11 o'clock worship service for two ushers to walk the collection money to the bank and put it in the overnight deposit. When Art Boomer was no longer able to do this, I (Patty Frandy) suggested to Rev. Ray Robinson that he ask Jack Hallock to do that duty. Rev. Ray responded, 'Well, Jack isn't officially a member of the church."

No, I said, but he is here every Sunday at the second service and he's trustworthy." Rev. Ray agreed and Jack took on that duty and performed it for many years. That describes Jack very well. You could count on him and he was trustworthy."

I recall that Helen was in a tornado by Lake Tomahawk many years ago. She was sucked out of her mobile home and a sofa came down on top of her. She only had a broken arms. That same tornado killed the father of one of our family practice doctors. Helen felt the Lord was watching over her."

I substituted for Ted on occasion. When we moved to Delevan, my mother was instrumental in getting me a position as the organist at a local church. I enjoyed doing that and did my best to provide meaningful music for the congregation. A number of people seemed to appreciate my contributions to the worship service, and I felt that I was making a difference for them.

I hope that in some small way the encouragement of my parents and my ability helped to bring people closer to Christ in the churches were I served."

"How do I begin to relate what a special person Ann Luckert was? There are so many positive adjectives I could use to describe her Christian, caring, compassionate, loving, honest, generous to a fault, and the list goes on.

We could give Ann a number of names. Helen Robinson and I had a name for her: Saint Ann. And we determined a life like hers needed to have a mission statement. We thought Ann's mission statement should be:

To service the people of the Northwoods and beyond, whomever, whatever, whenever, wherever, and however I can with no thought of personal gain, reward, or accolade.

Some would call Ann the Roller Derby Queen, not because she was an excellent roller skater, but because at Christmas, she probably rolled out more

sugar cookies and gingerbread men that anyone else in the Northwoods, probably the whole lover 48 states.

She was a Mister Rogers to children. They were drawn to her like a magnet. One of the reasons, I think, was that she was so genuine, and made everyone feel important.


She should have been at least a Board Member of Bounty paper towels because she was a quicker picker upper. She not only was adamant about picking up trash along the roadways, she also picked up many people. Whether she knew them or not, she'd ask someone walking on the shoulder of the road if they needed a ride, and them hop in. And if anyone at church ever needed a ride, they could always count on Ann to pick them up.

She worked hard for the church, Habitat for Humanity, the Lac du Flambeau Domestic Abuse program; financially supported umpteen charitable organizations; and was the caregiver for many shut-ins from church including Ruth Prims and Irma Biek, whom she helped selflessly for years.

She'd take on just about any task, with maybe one exception. She would never help decorate all those cookies she rolled out. But if anything else needed to be done or said, she did.

She was a shining light, the salt of the earth, and a true sheep among the goats."

Ministry Council Meeting Summary, Upper Room

Ministry Council Meeting Summary

Pastor Mark opened with prayer and called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., with the following people in attendance: Sue Claflin, Mary Fasse, Pastor Mark Gilbert, Jay Hull, Merry Jorgensen, Dave Kozeluh, Sara Kozeluh, Bob Nash, Holly Nash, Bob Schuld, and Jerry Weber. Absent: Sue Loeffler, Noah Lottig.

The following were highlighted as church accomplishments since the last meeting: The goal for the March Mission Match was surpassed, raising over \$4,000 the youth puppet show on Palm Sunday was well received by the congregation, Holy Week services and Easter Sunday worship went well. (Easter attendance: sixty-three people attended the in-person service, and at least twenty people attended the live-streamed service. In 2023, there were two Easter services, with eighty-three people attending in person and twenty-two watching the live-streamed service.)


Pastor Mark spoke about the Worship Time Change that will take place beginning May 26, 2024, when the service time changes from 10:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Work is being done to create a Welcome Center at the back of the sanctuary. Vision & Values banners that will be hung in the south entryway and the Pine Room are being finalized. Worship Volunteer Training will be held on May 15th. Noah Lottig is changing the live stream schedule. A sign with the new worship time is being made and will be hung on the exterior sign the week before the Memorial Day weekend.

The Ministry Council approved the recommendation from the Children, Youth, and Family Ministries to award Hakken Berklund a \$1000 scholarship from the Lillian Long Fund.

The Trustees will organize an all-church cleaning on May 10, 2024, from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. The Men's Group will provide lunch.

Pastor Mark presented a newly created document entitled "Defining Success Process" that outlines the process that will be used to measure success of the church's ministries, programs, and other activities: Step 1 - Express our Core Values as goals; Step 2 - Categorize all that we are doing and where they primarily fit into our Core Values; Step 3 - Annually, identify one or two ministries in each category to measure and how we will use the information; Step 4 - Identify two measurements for each ministry that will be used for evaluation. One measurement will be numerical/objective, and one will be narrative/subjective. The Ministry Council approved the recommended action item from the Key Leaders by consensus.

The next Ministry Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 14, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. in the Ministry Center.






Deborah Circle members cut and threaded ribbons for the drawstring bags for Midwest Mission Distribution Center's feminine hygiene kits.
