PASTOR'S MESSAGE

A Generous Witness

One of my favorite expressions is, "If you want to make God laugh, make a

plan." So many times, when we carefully get things put into place, God has other ideas. However, sometimes God doesn't laugh at our plans but says, 'I like it – but here's a little twist.'

I feel like that is what happened with our plan to focus on spiritual practices this year to help us grow in our awareness and responsiveness to God in our lives. The final spiritual practice that we have emphasized is the practice of sharing our witness with others. But it wasn't supposed to be. The plan had to change so we could better communicate other en us. I encourage you to look for ways to be things.

The plan changed; it's not a big deal – let's end with the spiritual practice of witnessing.

As a spiritual practice, witnessing is intentionally sharing our experience with God and others in various ways. There is no one way to witness how you have experienced God's presence in your life.

It just matters that you share it with others. Right here, I see God's little twist came into the plan.


God's twist is that, with the changes to the plan that moved the focus on witnessing to the October Pine Chips, we will be thinking about sharing our witness while we are doing our stewardship series in worship. Now, you might be wondering why this is a twist.

Our stewardship focus this year is on being generous, not just with our financial resources but with all that God has given us. We will be encouraged to recognize how God has been generous to every one of us and how we can share that generosity with others.

See the twist? Here it is: witnessing is sharing our experience of God's love and grace with others. Generosity is sharing what we have with others. They are the same thing! When we witness our faith, we are being generous. When we are generous, we are witnessing our faith. I could not have planned it, but God did!

Brothers and sisters, our best witness to our faith is to be generous with what God has givgenerous witnesses to one another and the entire world.

Ministry Council Meeting Summary, Fall Fun Day

Ministry Council

The Ministry Council met on Tuesday, September 19, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. with the following members in attendance: Chris Anderson, Jim Anderson, Sue Claflin, Donna Clark, Mary Fasse, Pastor Mark Gilbert, Merry Jorgensen, Dave Kozeluh, Sara Kozeluh, Sue Loeffler, Bob Schuld, and Holly Nash. Noah Lottig and Holly Nash were absent.

Accomplishments from this past month included: A successful Rummage and Bake Sale; the August Bible Study was well attended; the Wednesday Church School has begun and is off to a good start with ten kids enrolled; the brat sale was a success; having Victor Sandberg pay this organ this summer was nice; approximately 50 people attended the Community Table that was organized by Church of the Pines and two other churches; a memorial plaque for the flower garden has been made. Jack, Judy, and Joey Jurries were at church on Sunday, September 17th and had their photos taken with the plaque.

Each month, the annual church calendar is reviewed and upcoming activities are discussed. Pastor Mark is currently leading a Bible study entitled "Making Sense of the Bible," Venus will lead an Avent Study; our Stewardship Campaign, focusing on generosity, will be held during October.

A check for \$2,500 from our church mission fund will be presented to Lakeland Pantry.

Church of the Pines is sponsoring a table for the October 21st Food for Kidz rice meal packaging held at LUHS. Information will be made available to our congregation about volunteering to assemble the rice meals. Our congregation has also been asked to provide home-baked cookies for the volunteers for the event.

After completing an evaluation of the 8:30 a.m. summer worship services, and upon the recommendation of the Key Leaders group of Church of the Pines, the Ministry Council approved changing the year-round Sunday 10:00 a.m. service to a 9:30 a.m. service and no longer have an 8:30 a.m. service, beginning Memorial Day weekend 2024.

The Ministry Council also approved recommendations from the SPRC for a revision to the Personnel

Policy health insurance stipend and also added Worker's Compensation to the personnel policies.

Lay Leader, Venus Hilgart, requested \$99 from the Mission Fund to purchase the remaining rice meals that will be needed for a youth rice meal packaging mission project. The request was approved.

There was discussion, which will be continued, regarding what a successful church looks like and how we can measure success.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 17th at 7:00 p.m. in the Ministry Center.



Or, you can download a free Instant Church Directory app on your cell phone. Go to the app store on your phone and search for "Instant Church Directory."

If you are currently listed in the directory, please go into the directory and check to make sure all of your information is correct. You can make and submit changes. You can also upload a new photo to appear in the directory. If you did not have your phone number or email listed, please consider adding this information, especially if you serve in church leadership roles or are involved in church activities. When the directory was first published, there was an opportunity for you to set up a password for access. Go to our website at www.umchurchofthepines.org and in the top menu bar, select "More," and then click on "Church Directory" in the dropdown box. You can also do this on your phone if you have downloaded the Instant Church Directory app. If you originally set up a password, sign in using the email that you used in the directory and enter the password you previously established. If you cannot remember your password or if you did not initially set up a password, you will need to contact the church office for assistance.

If you are not currently in the directory and would like to participate, you will first need to complete a form, which can be obtained from the church office or print off a copy of the form from our church website. You can email a digital photo to office@umchurchofthepines.org or contact Merry to arrange to have a photo taken at church. Thanks. We hope to add some additional features to the directory in 2024.




