Pastor's Pen



LENT

I am not a betting man, but I am willing to bet that most of you, maybe even all of you (yes, I am hedging my bet), have heard of Lent before. Lent has had a long and varied history in the life of the Church. For example, some experts say that the great tradition of Friday fish fry, especially here in Wisconsin, comes from the Lenten practice of not eating meat on Fridays.

I think the most common practice of Lent in our faith right now is fasting or giving something up for 40 days before Easter. Some people give up eating meat on Fridays, or eating chocolate, or using social media. I once gave up playing computer games for Lent. The intention is to prepare ourselves for Easter by praying when we crave the things we gave up. Most people think that Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. Yet there is much about Lent today that we don't know.

For example, many think Lent is forty days before Easter. It is, but it is not *the* forty days before Easter because Sundays don't count so it is 46 days. So, if you gave up chocolate for Lent, you can have some on Sundays. Church historians have also pointed out that Lent has not always been forty days. Before 325 AD, Lent was often just a week – if there even was an official Lent.

I remember learning in seminary that new converts to Christianity in the ancient church used the time before Easter to prepare to become members of the church and to be baptized. My professor said that many felt this was the origin of Lent. Yet recently, one historian has argued that this is not the case. The origin of Lent was in a sense of lagging zeal among the church, and leaders wanted people to focus on self-

denial prior to the celebrations of Easter.

What does this all mean for us today as begin our Lenten season in 2020? For me, it means that regardless of when or how Lent started or what its original purpose was; Lent is about preparing to receive and celebrate the greatest thing ever – the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

Now, how to do that is a good question. I do find practicing some form of self-denial to have value, but I don't think it is the most effective. I think the best way to prepare for Easter is to grow in faith, and the best way to grow is to add more of what we need. Think of plants. Plants grow best with light and water. So, to help a plant grow - don't take something away; give it more of what it needs. Lent should be a time for us to give our faith more of what it needs.

That is why we are focusing on 5 essential practices of our faith during Lent, with Adam Hamilton's "*The Walk*." Each week is an opportunity, no matter where our faith is, to give our faith more of what it needs to grow. Instead of taking away, we will add to and nourish our faith.

I hope you will take the opportunities this Lent to prepare yourself for the wonder and power of Easter. I pray that you will find a way to grow in your faith and relationship with God through our Lenten experiences here at Church of the Pines.

If that means you need to go to a Friday fish fry, there is no problem with that.


Contribute to Church of the Pines' Easter Flower Fund





Ministry Council, UMCOR Sunday

Summary of Ministry Council Meeting

The Ministry Council met on February 18th at the area. The success of the Sunday Brunch was 7:00 p.m. with the following members in attendance: Jim Anderson, Sue Claflin, Pastor Mark Gilbert, Merry Jorgensen, Rich Klatt, Dave Kozeluh, Sue Loeffler, Holly Nash, Perry Schuette, Bob Schuld, Val Susor, Gretchen Voigt, Ted Voigt, and Sharry Wuest. Absent members: Jodi Capacio, Tom Frandy, and Jerry Weber.

Members identified church accomplishments since the last Council meeting: Well-attended Sunday Brunch; a wonderful Lay Sunday worship service; Valentine's Day cards that were signed and mailed to homebound and others away from the church this winter; new church directory is finished; the new location for LOGOS (lower level); new Little LOGOS volunteers have been identified.

Pastor Mark shared a Leadership Orientation Summary with Council members inviting members to stay informed; keep in communication with Pastor Mark and Merry Jorgensen; be connected and involved in the life of the church; be visible to the congregation; be familiar with the key issues for 2020 - General Conference; living without Rocking Horse; three focus areas of Hospitality, Telling Our Story, Strengthen youth and family ministries.

Merry Jorgensen, church administrator, shared information related to Valentine's Day Cards. 50 cards were mailed to homebound members who live in assisted living homes, those who are away for the winter, and those who have moved from

the result of delicious food and good promotion. A summary of Facebook activity was shared. In the first 48 days of 2020, there have been 66 posts that have reached 3,320 people. Our Facebook posts include photos and videos of our church activities, scripture, live streaming, inspirational & motivational posts, history, missions, shared stories, call to action issues, and links to our website. Photos of Ministry Council members have been posted on the kiosk bulletin board in the Pine Room and photos and contact information are on our church website. Our new online giving program is up and running. A total of \$500 has been contributed via Tithe.ly cell phone app and online giving via our church website. This total has been matched by \$500 for a total of \$1,000. Two additional donors have come forward to offer an additional \$500 match for another \$500 given online or via the Tithe.ly cellphone app. Church Directories are now available. Copies have been placed in the pews and homebound members who participated in the directory are receiving copies.

Council members will bring ideas to the next meeting for ways to use the proceeds from the sale of Rocking Horse furnishings.

Nancy Berklund and Louise Caroselli were elected to serve on our church Education Team.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 17, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the Pine Room.

Lay Speaker - Holly Nash

Holly Nash Recognized as a CERTIFIED LAY SPEAKER

CONGRATULATIONS TO HOLLY NASH who was presented her Certificate as a Certified Lay Speaker in The United Methodist Church by Pastor Mark Gilbert on February 2, 2020.

A Certified Lay Speaker is a layperson who has completed a course of training specified by the United Methodist Church and has obtained recommendations to become a Certified Lay Speaker. Now certified, Holly can serve the church in pulpit supply by preaching the Word when requested by the pastor, the district superintendent, or Committee on Lay Servant Ministries.

When asked "why did you want to become a Certified Lay Speaker," Holly shared the following: "After completing the Basic Lay Servant Course at the Church of the Pines, I was intrigued and wanted to learn more. Having no formal training in leading worship, preaching, etc. I wanted to develop and improve my skills. I felt called to start the journey by becoming a Certified Lay Speaker."

To become a Certified Lay Speaker, a person must first become a certified lay servant by completing specific courses so that a person can witness in the local church through preaching, teaching, and conducting worship services. Holly took the six courses required to become a Certified Lay Speaker: Preaching; Leading Worship; Leading Prayer; Discovering Spiritual Gifts; United Methodist Heritage (History); United Methodist Polity (how the worldwide United Methodist Church is governed). She took the courses over multiple weekends all around the state and also took two of the courses online.

After taking all the courses, Holly was approved by Pastor Mark, our charge conference in November 2019, and the District Committee on Lay Servant Ministries.

Holly may now be asked to serve in churches other than Church of the Pines, which would be something new for Holly. She plans to annually renew her role as a Certified Lay Speaker and will continue to take courses to further her knowledge and skills.

The Co-directors of the Lay Speaker Certification program of the Northwest District stated that "it was easy to see that Holly has a heart for her Lord and Savior."

We are blessed to have Holly Nash as a member of United Methodist Church of Pines and thank Holly for her commitment and dedication to our congregation and our ministries.



Mujila Falls Agricultural Center

This year, Mujila Falls is reaching out to women farmers in the area to plan one lima of soybeans. Mujila Falls provides all of the seed and fertilizer and guarantees to buy the harvest, helping God's people to support their families. The Center works with the Lunda people of extreme North West Zambia. The Lunda have the highest infant mortality rates and lowest life expectancy of all the tribes in Africa. The greatest need is to improve protein, vitamin and mineral content in the local diet, and to help families' incomes so they can provide for basic necessities. The Center continues to expand milk and egg production, and works to make Lunda farmers competitive in their agricultural pursuits.
